INCREASING AND ALIGNING HOUSING SUPPLY

In this workshop we will hear from **Neath Port Talbot Council** and **Powys County Council** about how they are increasing supply, and discuss the challenges and solutions to inform local action.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY HEALTH OUTREACH

In this workshop we will hear from practitioners from Cardiff and Vale and Cwm Taf Morgannwg about their multi-disciplinary outreach and partnership work to meet the health needs of people experiencing homelessness.

DATA AND LEADERSHIP

Learn more about the work undertaken by **Conwy County Borough Council** to take a strategic approach to rapid rehousing, including restructuring teams, securing the support of corporate and political leaders, and using data better understand and meet people's needs.

LEASING SCHEME WALES: INCREASING SUPPLY IN THE PRS

The Welsh Government will provide an update on the work local authorities are doing with the private rented sector to increase supply in the short term, particularly focussing on single people and models of housing to support them.

WORKING WITH CRIMINAL JUSTICE PARTNERS

In this workshop we will hear from Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council about their Built for Zero approach to meeting the housing needs of people leaving prison.

REDUCING RELIANCE ON UNSUITABLE TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION

Hear from the Isle of Anglesey County Council and Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council about their approach to reducing reliance on unsuitable temporary accommodation.

RAPID REHOUSING, FAIR FUTURES: EMBEDDING EQUALITY IN EVERY STEP

In this workshop **Tai Pawb** and the **Welsh Refugee Council** will explore how rapid rehousing can deliver not just homes but fairer outcomes. We will focus on the experiences of refugees and other groups at risk of exclusion, and discuss the challenges and solutions to ensure equality is embedded in local approaches.
